WHISLER DECLARATION

- I, Les Whisler, am competent to testify on the matters set forth herein and make this declaration of my own personal knowledge and belief:
- 1. I was friends with the founder and developer of Foxhall Community, Virgil Adams, at the time he developed Foxhall in approximately 1980-81. At that time I worked for the engineering firm Howard Godat and Assoc.
  - 2. I bought the property through the real estate agent Dennis Adams, Virgil's son.

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3. Because Foxhall was being developed as equestrian friendly with access to several miles of equestrian trials, I bought two 5 acre parcels and built a house, stables for our own

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horses, an attached riding arena for our family's use, and a building for storing hay and equipment on one five acre parcel.

- 4. The Foxhall Community Association Covenants and governing board were already in place when the property was purchased.
- 5. Virgil and/or Dennis approached us to consider taking some boarders as it would make the development more desirable for equestrian families. Within the first five years we did start to board a limited few (2-4) horses, both from Foxhall residents and non-residents that lived in the area. After taking on boarders, the non-residents routinely used the Foxhall equestrian trails during the duration of my ownership of the property. Neither Virgil nor Dennis ever indicated that the non-resident boarders could not use the Foxhall equestrian trails or that they had to be accompanied by a resident when using those trials.
- 6. There were never any signs on any of the equestrian trials at Foxhall when I lived there prohibiting boarders or guests of residents from using or that the riders on the equestrian trails had to be accompanied by a resident.
- 7. I was on the board for the association for approximately 15 years and was President of the board for approximately 10 years.
- 8. The 5 acres with the house, arena and outbuildings was sold in 2001 with no discussion or sale of a horse boarding business with Judy Johnston.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and accurate to the best of my knowledge and belief.
